Cody Brown Memorial Scholarship



The Cody Brown Memorial Scholarship program:

- Is sponsored by the Griffin School Foundation in cooperation with The Community Foundation of South Puget Sound.
- Recognizes the achievements of Griffin School graduates.
- Awards scholarships for any type of post-high school education or training.

Applicants must:

- Be a former **Griffin School** student who attended a minimum of two years at Griffin School.
- Be a high school senior in a public or accredited private high school in Thurston County as of September of the application year.

Scholarship awards are determined by using the following factors:

- **Demonstrated academic ability:** Applicant must have a **minimum accumulated GPA of 3.0**. Student need not be at the top of his/her class.
- **Extracurricular Activities/Community Service:** Volunteer projects and active participation in community and/or school activities that exemplify a commitment to excellence.
- **Career goals:** An indication of how the scholarship might contribute to future career goals. Please identify your areas of interest and how you have prepared yourself to enter this field of study.
- **Mentoring:** Demonstrated ability to be a mentor or “encourager” to peers.
- **Applicant Appraisal:** Two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a teacher/advisor, and one from someone who can comment on a student’s overall character, achievement, and promise.
- **Stability:** Length of attendance at Griffin School.

What can this scholarship be used for? Scholarships can be used for any type of education or training beyond high school. The award will be made upon verification of enrollment in the student's choice of an accredited college, university or vocational institution.

How many scholarships are available and how much are the scholarships worth?

One Cody Brown Memorial Scholarship is awarded per year. For 2012, the award will be \$1,000. The scholarship will be awarded at the Griffin School Promotion Ceremony in June.

When is the scholarship application deadline?

The application deadline is Friday April 27, 2012 at 5:00 p.m.

Applications will be sent to Thurston County area high schools beginning March 2012.

NOTE: Members of the immediate families of any Scholarship Committee members are eligible to apply with the provision that the related family member not serve on the committee during the year in which the application is considered.

HOW TO APPLY

Who May Apply: Any Griffin graduate who is graduating from a Thurston County High School with an accumulated GPA of 3.0 and will attend any form of accredited post high school training or education.

Instructions:

Complete all parts of this application form and submit with the other required materials by the deadline. Incomplete applications will not be considered for the scholarship. Packet must include the following:

1. Enclose a one or two page essay about yourself. Address the following:
 - Tell us about your personal life story and experience; include extra-curricular and community service activities that show your commitment to excellence and mentoring abilities.
 - Explain your long-term goals, chosen area of study (if known) and how education will help you achieve your goals. Discuss what you have done or will do to prepare yourself for your particular field of study.

It is recommended that you review scholarship qualifications and requirements then incorporate your eligibility and qualifications into your written essay.

2. Enclose an additional page listing personal, extra-curricular and/or community service activities.
3. Enclose **two** letters of recommendation from current or former teachers, employers, or community members (not family members). Ask individuals who know you well to address the following points when they write their letters of recommendation:
 - What is your assessment of this applicant's qualification for this scholarship?
 - Discuss the applicant's demonstrated contribution to the community or classroom. Include specific examples of mentoring, encouraging, unifying.
 - Include any more information you consider relevant to this scholarship.
4. Enclose a transcript through the first semester of your senior year. Please check with your high school records office to ensure sufficient transcript processing time in order to meet the deadline for application.

Letter of Recommendation Guidelines

To Whom It May Concern:
